# Praising God in Devon

Dearest friends,

I'm very much looking forward to our Holy Habits course this Thursday.

Last week I told you about the first week - bodily prayer, why we cross ourselves, and why that's important.

Next week (14<sup>th</sup>) we'll be talking about Gratitude. Gratitude is a tough old habit, but it is a habit we learn.

It's important that we don't confuse gratitude with joy, or happiness – or indeed happiness with joy! No, gratitude is a spiritual discipline that has deep roots in scripture and in various Christian traditions.

There are ways that we can pray, we can act, that encourage us to think in positive ways. That help us see the gifts of God around us.

We often end up training ourselves to be negative, but with a little effort we can create a new habit of Gratitude.

Gratitude is more than a mental exercise, more than a formula of words. We cannot be satisfied to make a mental note of things which God has done for us and then perfunctorily thank Him for favours received. To be grateful is to recognize the love of God in everything He has given us—and He has given us everything.

Every breath we draw is a gift of His love, every moment of existence is grace, for it brings with us immense graces from Him.

Gratitude therefore takes nothing for granted, is never unresponsive, is constantly awakening to new wonder, and to praise of the goodness of God.

The grateful person knows that God is good, not by hearsay but by experience. And that is what makes all the difference... Gratitude is therefore the heart of the Christian life.
